Normally, SPSS computes a 95 per cent confidence intervall for the ICC; this value can be changed via keyword CIN. Likewise, by default SPSS computes a test whether the observed ICC is significantly different from zero; keyword TESTVAL can change the value against which the observed ICC is tested (in this example, to 0.4).
